health care addresses the physical health of people with mental health problems and the conditions that have an association with increased risk of mental health problems mental health promotion engages with the ways in which early intervention can either prevent or alleviate the effects of mental health problems challenging behaviours presents a range of risk assessments specifically focused upon challenging behaviours now addresses emerging issues such as the transitioning of mental health care to primary care the development of peer and service user led services accreditation and credentialing mental health nurse incentive program

psychiatric and mental health nursing theory and practice was conceived as a result of three major premises which in the view of the editors relate to the practice of psychiatric and mental health nursing first that high quality psychiatric and mental health nursing can be practised only if it is underpinned by appropriate nursing theory secondly that there exists a body of theory which can and should be applied to psychiatric and mental health nursing thirdly that there is a need for a text which will assist teachers students and clinicians to apply available nursing and borrowed theory to clinical practice the general aim of this book is to introduce nursing students to a theory based approach to caring for people with psychiatric and mental health problems the phrase psychiatric and mental health problems indicates that the text relates to clients with a psychiatric diagnosis and also to those who have mental health problems but who do not necessarily have such a diagnosis the client group to which the material in this text applies will include those who are or have been hospitalized and those in the community who have not been and may never be hospitalized the intended readership is all students of psychiatric and mental health nursing issues for example basic and post basic nurses and their teachers

in order to provide sound person centred care mental health nursing students need a thorough understanding of theory alongside the ability to translate this knowledge into practice it can be difficult to apply ideas from the classroom and books when learning how to work with mental health service users for the first time that is why the theoretical aspects of this book are presented alongside realistic accounts of nursing practice fundamentals of mental health nursing is a case based and service user centred textbook for mental health nursing students designed to support students throughout their pre registration studies the text covers the essential knowledge required to provide high quality nursing care contributions from real service users and cases of fictional clients are explored in detail to provide excellent transferable skills for practice dedicated chapters explore fundamental nursing skills and mental health law before providing a case based exploration of the areas and subjects that will be encountered by students in university and placement practice based
